The Use and Impact of Sports Premium at WSL 2016-17

Summary

Another successful year where Sports Premium has allowed us to meet the objectives set out. Staff have had access to training opportunities and Continued Professional Development (CPD) and are more confident to deliver better quality teaching and learning with upgraded equipment and improved provision.

The children have been given opportunities to compete in tournaments with other schools. They have fully participated and thoroughly enjoyed all events organised internally and externally such as Dance Festival, Wake up and Shake up. Some activities have been subsidised so that pupils do not miss out due to financial constraints. Pupils participated in the Summer Event e.g. water sports. All children have benefitted regardless of sporting ability.

The school has maximised opportunities for both in school and out of school sporting opportunities. The results of all the competitions and participation of all sports events have been and will continue to be celebrated via the school Weekly Newsletter and website.

The Use of Sports Premium at WSL 2017-2018

Sports Premium

The money is provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. It is allocated to primary schools. It can only be spent on provision of PE and Sport in schools.

What is the Sports Premium?

The Government is providing additional funding for the school years 2017-2018 to improve provision of Physical Education (PE) and Sport in primary schools. Waltham St Lawrence receives £17,000

What is the purpose of the grant?

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport according to Guidance for PE and Sport Premium for Primary Schools October 2017. This includes:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified quality assured sports coaches to work alongside teachers when teaching PE
- Paying for quality assured Professional Development modules and opportunities for teachers in PE and Sport
- Running Sport Competitions
- Buying quality assured materials and equipment to extend provision given by the National Curriculum
- Providing places of pupils on after school Sports Clubs and Holiday Clubs
- Providing active playground and active teaching



Objectives of spend

- Joining the Ascot & Maidenhead School Sport Partnership (SSCO). This provides support for Maidenhead and Windsor Schools including Professional Development for teachers and Teaching Assistants and supporting resources such as The Real PE Scheme of Work and Assessment Wheel; entry into all School Games and SSCO competitions and associated costs;
- Training and providing continuous professional development for staff;
- Broadening the sporting opportunities and experiences available to pupils at WSL;
- Developing a passion for sport and physical activities;
- Supporting and involving the least active children by providing targeted activities;
- Enhancing the school environment to embed physical activities throughout the school day

How will we measure the impact?

- Successful implementation of Real PE Scheme of Work ‘Create Development’ in all year groups, evidenced through curriculum planning, monitoring and relevant lessons and events evaluation information
- The number of children participating in the sport activities has increased
- The number of activities offered has increased
- Increased opportunities for participation in a range of sport competitions
- Successful implementation of in house competitions
- Children enjoy using equipment on a daily basis, both in PE lessons and during break/lunchtime and after school clubs.
- Children have developed a passion for sports and physical activities
