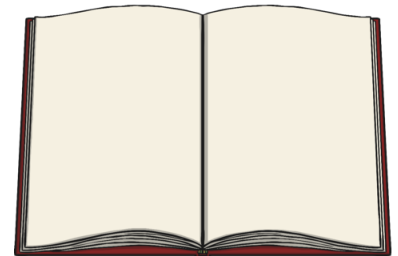
I am pleased to say that we have had a very busy start to the new academic year. The children have returned to school smartly dressed, happy, polite, positive and eager to learn.

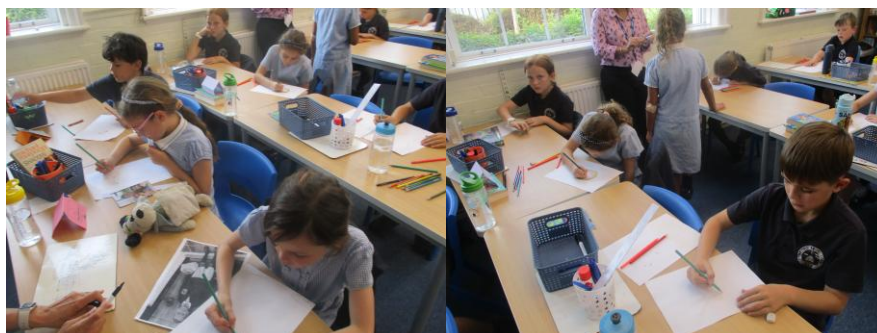
GIFTS, CARDS AND KIND WORDS – THANK YOU

Attendance and Punctuality

At Waltham St. Lawrence Primary School, we place a strong emphasis on excellent attendance and punctuality. Our school target for attendance this academic year is 97% as in previous years. Every school day matters, and arriving on time ensures your child starts the day calmly and ready to learn. Please support us by ensuring your child attends school every day and arrives promptly. If your child is unwell, please inform the school office as early as possible.

As you may be aware, there is increased focus on attendance from the government. We are here to support you in identifying reasons behind low attendance and signposting support services to help families and children. Pupils with attendance of less than 90% are regarded by the Government as having Persistent Absence and pupils with attendance in danger of falling to this level will be invited into school for support and an action plan.

Please book doctors or hospital appointments outside of school time or during school holidays where possible.

In line with DfE and RBWM policies, we will not be granting holidays within term time. This will be recorded as unauthorised and may lead to the issuing of an Education Penalty Notice if attendance concerns are highlighted.

VERY IMPORTANT UPDATE

Nut /Food Allergy – Benedict's Law

Benedict's Law came into force in School from 1st September 2026 and is something that we take with the utmost importance. We have children and adults in school who have nut allergies, so please could we remind you that we are an allergy aware school and ask all parents to continue to be vigilant and not bring or send in lunchboxes any nuts or nut products on to the school site. Children are also not allowed to share food with each other to avoid any incidents. Please could we remind all parents to keep us informed about any food allergies or food intolerances that your children may have.

Before you arrive - Immaculate Uniform

Please continue to support our high expectations for uniform in school. We will be strictly enforcing these expectations at the start of this new academic year and expect all children to adhere to them. We are incredibly proud of children's smart presentation and believe that it shows our unique school character and high expectations for every member of our school community.

Children must have their PE kit in school every day, not just PE days. They also need to ensure that they have adequate long sleeve tops and tracksuits once the weather turns colder. Please use a drawstring bag for their PE kit. NO rucksacks are allowed.

Reminder: ALL items must be labelled with children's names, including PE kit. Thank you for your support.

Arriving at School

7.45am-8.30am Breakfast Club (Monday to Friday)

8.30am - Please ensure that your children arrive for 8.30am each morning when the gate will be open so that they do not miss the morning register taken at 8.40am promptly.

No pupils should be in school before 8.30am for safeguarding reasons, except for those who attend Breakfast Club starting at 7.45am.

There will always be a learning task for the children to focus on in class and this allows them to settle and prepare for the day of learning; reducing anxiety and unnecessary worry.

There will be a one-way system at Drop Off and Pick Up times as usual. Adult volunteers will be at the Stop and Drop Zone daily to assist children. We would ask parents to remain in your cars when dropping off at the Stop and Drop Zone and then drive away once your child gets out. This will help the traffic flow to allow the next car to arrive.

Parents of Reception children in Owls Class can drop off their children at the gate initially. Once children are settled, we would encourage all parents to use the Stop and Drop system.

If you arrive after the school bell rings at 8.40am and there is not a member of the "stop-and-drop" team by the roadside, please can you park your car and accompany your child to the school office and sign in the 'Late Arrival Book'. This is to ensure that no child is left in the "grey area" of being dropped off by a parent but not "received" by a member of staff, as the blue gates at the side of the school building must be locked at 8.40am when the morning bell rings.

8.40am School Starts – Bell rings and Register taken

10.50am -Break Time

We provide children in EYFS and KS1 with daily fruit and vegetables snacks. Please ensure your child in KS2 brings healthy snacks e.g. fruit or vegetables and fresh water. If your child chooses to have packed lunch, we encourage parents to make healthy packed lunches. Fizzy drinks, sweets or sticky fruit winders should not be included (fresh or dry fruit only).

12.00pm - Lunch Time

The kitchen serves a full menu with freshly cooked lunch every day on site and we strongly encourage all children to take up the option of a hot meal, particularly in the cold winter months.

As from September 2026, the school meal will cost £2.98 raised from £2.92.

Children will follow a Staggered Timetable to eat in the Dining Hall.

If you decide not to take a School lunch, you can send in a packed lunch from home. We would like to remind parents that we are a healthy school. Please ensure there are no glass bottles, fizzy drinks, sweets or chocolates. **Please can I remind all parents that we are an allergy aware School.**

3.10pm- End of School day

Please remember to be considerate and courteous when parking on the road before and after school. Please do not park across driveways to avoid any unnecessary inconvenience to our neighbours. Please always drive within the speed limit for the safety of the children and all road users. Thank you for your cooperation. Please do not park on the zigzag area and Double Yellow Lines.

To ensure that all children are safely collected from the school playground, whilst maintaining our "open door" policy for communication with members of staff, we have the following system.

Owls – Parents to wait in "Owls" playground. Children will be dismissed from Owls classroom door when the class teacher sees the child's parent. Please do not approach the Class Teacher until all children from your child's class have been collected.

Nightingales - Parents to wait at the "top end" of the playground, outside Kestrels Class windows. Children will be dismissed from Nightingales side classroom door when the class teacher sees the child's parent. Please do not approach the Class Teacher until all children from your child's class have been collected.

Robins, Skylarks, Red Kites, Kestrels – Parents to wait at the "top end" of the playground, outside Kestrels Class windows. The children will line up in class groups and will be dismissed when the teacher sees the child's parent. Please do not approach the class teacher until all children from your child's class have collected.

The children who attend Woodpeckers Club, after school clubs and those who take the School Bus will also line up at the lower end of the playground so that their safety can be ensured.

Please note that for all classes the aim is to maintain a gap between the children lining up and the waiting parents. This is to ensure that all children leave the teacher only when their parents have definitely been seen. It will safeguard children at a transitional time of the day when they are potentially vulnerable.

If someone other than yourself or your nominated person(s) will be collecting your child, please tell a member of staff. We cannot release your child to anyone who has not been authorised.

IMPORTANT CHANGE:

Due to our strict implementation of Benedict's Law, we kindly ask that no sweets / cakes are brought to school for children's birthdays. Thank you for your understanding and support.

RBWM School Bus

I would like to remind all eligible families about our online booking system through SCOPAY. Parents should record which days and journeys they would like their children to make by 8pm on Sunday evening for the following week. If you would like to add or remove your children from the bus list for the following week, after this deadline, this can only be done via a call or email to the school office.

In order to ensure that all children are safe, if they are on the list, they will be expected to be on the bus (barring absence from school) and if they are not on the list they will not be allowed on the bus, even if they believe they should be using it to travel home. Should that situation arise, the child will be brought into the school for their safety to be collected from the office by their parent after a phone call home.

As always, we expect the children to commit to a whole course, not to drop out at their own discretion. Please notify the School Office or the Class Teachers as soon as possible if your child cannot attend a session due to illness or other valid reason. Children who do not attend regularly at their own discretion will be asked to leave the club so that others on the waiting list can join.

Children are expected to follow the School Golden Rules and demonstrate School Values at all times. Any behaviour which disrupts the learning and enjoyment of other children in the Clubs will not be tolerated. In some circumstances if there is consistent disruption to the learning and enjoyment of others, this may result in the child being asked to leave the club for some or all subsequent sessions.

We expect our children to show respect to all staff who give up their time to run such a wide range extracurricular activity after school. We would appreciate your support in this matter.

The end of the School day

If your child arrives home and tells you something that happened in school that concerns you...

May I remind you that we operate an 'Open Door' policy and parents are always welcome to speak with a member of staff or with me about any concerns. During busy times, however, it may be necessary to arrange an appointment via the School Office.

I would like to emphasise that if there is an incident at school involving your child or others, it is very important that you contact and inform the school directly. We strongly urge parents not to use social media such as WhatsApp to discuss or address school related incidents. These platforms are not the appropriate place for resolving concerns and can often lead to misunderstandings or unnecessary distress for those involved. I reassure you that we always take your concerns seriously and handle every situation with care and confidentiality. We address all matters promptly, fairly and sensitively in line with our school policies. We are committed to working with you to ensure a positive and respectful resolution.

Other Important Information

Changes to free school meals from the 2026 to 2027 academic year (Please find below a letter regarding potential changes to Free School Meal Provision)

Dear Parent or Carer,

We are writing to let you know about changes to free school meals (FSM) from the start of the 2026 to 2027 academic year.

What is changing? - Expanded entitlement for families on Universal Credit

From the start of academic year 2026 to 2027, all children in households receiving Universal Credit will be entitled to free school meals, regardless of earnings.

Going forward, there will be two types of eligibility:

Targeted FSM: for households in receipt of universal credit earning £7,400 or less (includes free meals and additional support such as pupil premium).

Other educational entitlements such as the Holiday Activities and Food program (HAF) and the 'extended rights' element of school travel assistance, will also continue to be based on targeted FSM.

Expanded FSM: for households in receipt of universal credit earning above £7,400 (free meals only)
Families with no recourse to public funds may also be eligible for Targeted FSM subject to meeting separate criteria.

All pupils in reception, year 1 and year 2 will also continue to be entitled to free school meals under the universal infant free school meals policy regardless of family circumstances.

End of transitional protections

Since 2018, some children have continued to receive free school meals, even if their family circumstances changed during the rollout of Universal Credit. This is referred to as transitional protections.

Now that entitlement is being expanded to all families on Universal Credit, these protections will end at the end of the 2025 to 2026 academic year.

This means:

- Some children may **no longer be eligible** from the start of the 2026 to 2027 academic year if their family does not receive Universal Credit or another qualifying benefit
- Eligibility will now be based on current benefit status

What you need to do

If your child currently receives free school meals:

- In most cases, you do not need to reapply
- Your child's school or the local authority will check your eligibility automatically using the details already held and inform you of any changes to your FSM eligibility
- In some cases, your child's school or the local authority may contact you to confirm your details
- If your child is starting a new school in September, they will be in touch to confirm whether you need to confirm your details or reapply.
- If you are unsure, please contact your school or local authority for advice.

If your child does not currently receive free school meals

- You may now be eligible under the expanded criteria
- You will need to apply through your local authority / school

Please contact the School office if you would like any further information.
