Dear Parents/Carers,

We hope that you all had a restful and happy holiday, enjoyed spending time with your families and friends. We are delighted to welcome you all back for our final Summer Term 5 and 6 and are looking forward to an exciting term ahead.

We continue to be committed to 'Outstanding' standards in all areas and promote confidence, independence, resilience and hard work. Through our embedded Growth Mindset approach, the children understand that in order to learn they must be brave and not afraid of making mistakes, and this allows them to tackle challenges they would not have attempted before. As Teachers and Teaching Assistants, we never stop learning and the school provides opportunities for all staff to have Continuous Professional Development (CPD) linked to the school priorities and national initiatives. This term we carry on further developing our learner's Metacognitive Skills and Self-Regulated Learning Approach, teaching children to apply the strategy of 'Plan, Monitor and Evaluate' as part the learning process. This will empower the children to become effective and independent learners. We value your great support and partnership in all that we do.

As we enter the final terms of this academic year, we would expect **ALL of the children, including children from Reception to come to school independently.** Please use our Stop and Drop Zone and let your child/ren walk into the school by themselves. This will encourage children to **develop self-help skills and independence** and settle in quickly to the day ahead. Thank you for your support.

What have we been learning in school?

As the first lesson in their 'Sensational Safari' topic, children in Robins Class learnt some geographical facts about Kenya. After a recap of the continents and oceans of the world, they used atlases to locate Kenya and many of its geographical features and marked them onto their maps.



In **Science**, the children were using what they have learnt about materials and structures to build a paper bridge strong enough to support a toy car. Teamwork was a major part of the exercise, as they all had to put their ideas forward and discuss them, in order to come up with a design they all agreed on and then build it together. They had some good ideas and a lot of fun building but they also learnt a lot along the way, when things didn't go quite according to plan!



Children in KS2 had a wonderful 'Adventure with Pandas' online session on Tuesday this week organised by Oxford Brooks University. They enjoyed a virtual visit to the Panda Park in Chengdu, China, took part enthusiastically in Quizzes, games and live discussions with panda experts and had fun making a 3-D paper panda. This links really well to the Science topic children are learning on habitats. Here are some comments from children:

Do giant panda hibernate?



What do you know about giant pandas? Are giant pandas only black and white? How many fingers does a giant panda have on its front paw? Where are the giant pandas distributed in China? Which body parts can we use to identify pandas? How many years do pandas live in the wild? How long does a giant panda's pregnancy last?





For our Relationship and Health Education Curriculum this term via The Big Think, we will be focusing on the Core Value of Community and its related values of Non-violence, Kindness to Animals and Celebrating difference. We will spend two weeks on each related value this term. At the assembly on Monday we introduced the first related value of Non-Violence. Next week we will continue with Non-Violence. Children in their class will have a discussion on this topic and are encouraged to think about 'Can you control your anger? Or Can you stay in control when provoked?' Children are encouraged to stay calm and peaceful when resolving conflicts. You may want to spend some time at home with your child/ren exploring the meaning of this quote 'In a gentle way, you can shake the world.' - Mahatma Gandhi (Indian Activist 1869-1948) What might he mean?
