Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a pleasure visiting all classes, seeing children continuing to demonstrate positive attitudes towards learning and engaging with a wide variety of carefully planned learning activities. Our Year 6 children are working very hard preparing for their SATs, taking place in the week beginning 8th May 2023. Year 2 children are also working hard to have a final push to focus on their spelling. Please read the letter sent home today for details. Children in Owls Class have settled really well, becoming more independent. I am very impressed with how some of our youngest children can apply their phonics skills to read with confidence! Please continue to support your children by reading daily at home, practising their spelling, learning number bonds and times tables and ensuring your children are completing their set homework to a high standard. Your support at home will really make a huge difference! Working in partnership with School Staff, your children will achieve their potential.

At WSL, every child is reader. Children learn to read and read for pleasure! As such we ensure we have the right provision and have established a strong school culture which supports and encourages reading for pleasure. Mrs Clark, TA based in KS1, is also responsible for our **School Library**. Over the last few weeks, she has worked hard to make sure all the new books are catalogued using our existing classification system. We will now organise a more formal weekly library session for the children to attend on a rota basis. During the session, children in small groups will be taught how to find and use resources in our Library, use the research process, appreciate literature and develop important library skills. This week some children have had a session with Mrs Clark learning how to independently borrow and return books using Librasoft Librarian.



What have we been learning in school?


This term, Year 1 children in **Nightingales Class** have been learning about **Plants** as part of their **Science** topic. They have been making observations on different types of flowers, seeds and bulbs. The children have compared and found out similarities and differences. As part of the follow up activities, they planted some seeds, following specific instructions. They will now be ready to observe, monitor and record the growth of their own plant.















As part of the Multiplication and Division Unit in Maths, the Year 1 children have been learning about arrays. An array in Maths is an arrangement of objects, numbers or pictures in columns or rows. They have been doing a lot of practical activities and using a variety of equipment/materials e.g. sticks, stones, counters etc as visual aids to help them understand the concept of sharing and grouping. They have learned to use appropriate mathematical language such as rows and columns to describe arrays. Please support your child at home by helping them to count in 2s, 5s and 10s and describing 'How many groups of 2, 5 or 10? and How many in each group? or How many rows or columns? How many in each row or column? You can use a tray of eggs for example, to help consolidate your child's understanding.



Core Value - Community During the next two weeks we will be focusing on the value of **Kindness to Animals**. Children in their class will have a discussion on this topic and are encouraged to think about 'How do you show kindness to animals? How might you support the welfare of animals? You may want to spend some time at home with your child/ren exploring the meaning of this quote 'The question is not, 'Can they reason?' nor 'Can they talk?' but 'Can they suffer?' — Jeremy Bentham, English philosopher (1748-1832) What might he mean?
