What have we been learning in school?

Whilst Year 5 and 6 have gone on their residential trip, children in Year 3 and 4 have been working on a cross-curricular topic of **Time**, integrated with various subjects. In Maths, children learned to read and compare analogue and digital clocks, applying their skills to solve problems related to time. On Sundays we operate a safe, fun environment where school aged children can come along, take part and learn the skills and values associated with rugby. Teamwork, Respect, Enthusiasm, Discipline and Sportsmanship. We are now in our run down to the end of the season where all age groups are working on their core skills with varied and interesting training (including game play) every Sunday at the Sports Ground on Institute Road, Taplow (SL6 ONS). Now is the perfect time to come along and give it a go! Training will continue until 16th July 2023 and resume again in September 2023.
