
I learned that plants need water, sun, food and heat.— Alice

Childhood Anxiety Workshop for Parents on Wednesday evening of 14<sup>th</sup> June, led by Juanita Tarn, Senior Mental Health Practitioner, went really well. Junita shared a range of strategies and techniques for helping your child/ren manage their worry and anxiety. Here are just a couple of techniques:


- She emphasised the importance of **validating children's feelings**. Let your child/ren know that their feelings are valid and that it's okay to be anxious. Assure them that you understand their emotions and that you are there to support them.
- She also suggested that parents **help their children learn and practise relaxation techniques** like deep breathing, progressive muscle relaxation, or visualization. These techniques can help them manage their anxiety in stressful situations.
- Junita also encouraged parents to **teach your child problem-solving skills** to tackle their anxiety-provoking situations. Help them break down challenges into smaller, manageable steps, and celebrate their successes along the way.

I would like to thank Juanita Tarn for giving up her time to deliver this very useful session, sharing her expertise and knowledge. Thank you to parents who attended the session. I hope you have gained valuable insights into recognising the signs of anxiety, communicating with your children about their worries, fears and implementing strategies to help them cope and thrive. Parental involvement and support are crucial in helping children navigate and overcome anxiety. Together we can create a supportive and nurturing environment for the well-being of our children. # What have we been learning in school?

In Maths this week, children in Robins Class were using the Bee-Bots to review the work they have been doing on Position and Direction. Using directional language, they had to work in pairs to create a route from where the Bee-Bot was, to a given destination. It was then programmed to follow their directions and, as you can see from some of their faces, it was quite exciting every time it stopped, to see whether their next instruction was going to be correct. It was great fun!











Core Value - Community. We will be focusing on the related value of **Conservation: Clean Air** during the next two weeks. Children in their class will have a discussion on this topic and are encouraged to think about 'What actions would YOU take to help improve the quality of the air around you?' If we all make a small change, then we can have a big impact on our climate.

Perhaps you can ask your child/ren to think of a few small things that they can do at home that might help to clean our air. You may also want to spend some time at home with your child/ren exploring the meaning of this quote "There is no such thing as away. When you throw something away, it must go somewhere.' — Annie Leonard, Executive Director of Green Peace USA (1964 - ) What might he mean?
