Balaceability and Bikeability - The children in Owls Class have really enjoyed this bespoke programme we offer at WSL and have made incredible progress this year. First, they started on balance bikes where they learnt to balance and glide with confidence. The children practised a range of skills involving weaving, turning and circling. Now they progressed onto pedal bikes and most of the children are now confident to ride, showing expertise in mounting, setting off and breaking. As we are approaching the end of academic year, we run out of time to compete the programme, therefore, we strongly recommend parents take the stabilisers off your children's bikes at home and continue this pedalling journey throughout the summer. We are so unbelievably proud of the children and their Growth Mindset when riding the bikes, they never gave up! Well done to all! Thank you, parents, for all your support. We would like to inform you that next week will be the last week we are running bikeability.



What have we been learning in school?

In **Science** this week, the children in **Robins Class** looked at lots of pictures of bug hotels and then drew their own design. The children then made a joint class bug hotel with rooms made of different materials to suit different bugs, and put it near their allotment. The plants in the allotment have grown a lot. The lettuces and the pak choi are ready to eat.



On Tuesday this week, children in **Robins Class** had a **DT Day**. The design brief was to make a 'Healthy Wrap'. They began by thinking about sugar and hidden sugars in foods and drinks. They were quite surprised at how much there was in some of the drinks when they estimated, and then checked the order they would be in. Next, they recapped what a healthy diet is. Having heard the design brief in full, they all tried many combinations of the ingredients - a protein, a dairy and a veg (one of which was one of their own lettuces!) making up each combination. They then chose their favourite 3 combinations and, as a table, put forward their ideas and voted for the one they wanted to make. They prepared all the ingredients they needed to use, made their wraps and, of course, ate them! The final thing to do was a review, thinking about appearance, smell and taste, and scoring it out of 5. Mrs Wiseman was very proud of some of the children for trying some foods that they had not eaten before. A big THANK YOU goes to Mrs Wiseman for organising this DT Day, making it fun and helping the children develop so many skills.
