# Dear Parents/Carers,

Thank you to parents who attended the **KS2 Reading / Homework Workshop** on Wednesday this week. We hope you have found the workshop informative and helpful. You now have better understanding of the National Curriculum End of the Year Reading Expectations for each year group in KS2. You have also learned some strategies which you can use at home to best support your child's reading, which can then help develop your child's writing. For those who were not able to attend, we have some handouts available for your reference. If you need further information, please come to speak with Mrs Cubage, Mrs Ablewhite or Mr Errington at a mutually convenient time.





At the meeting, we emphasised how important it is for the children to **read EVERY DAY! Reading** really is an essential life skill and reading at home every day will support our children in developing the fluency they need to understand/comprehend what they have read. Research clearly shows a direct correlation between children who read and have access to a wide range of vocabulary and their future success in their chosen careers. **Reading will also help with children's writing, one of the key focuses for our School Improvement Plan this year.** 

Remember: - You can't write a story unless you can **tell** a story. You can't tell a story unless you have heard a story. Let's all work together and encourage our children to read daily and '**Read as a writer'** (spot good bits and techniques used and be a Magpie!) and '**Write as a reader'** (applying the ideas to their own writing)! Together we can help our children to achieve their potential. Thank you for your support.



On Wednesday this week, the whole school took part in the **National Fitness Day** 10@10 Live Stream Broadcast, this event was run by Leisure Focus in partnership with Maidenhead and Ascot Schools Sports Partners and Windsor Schools Sports Partnership. We were one of the 21 Schools and over 4,156 pupils from Maidenhead and Windsor signing up to take part in this event. The 10@10 is a perfect way to help achieve the children's 60 minutes of activity a day. It was fantastic, all the children thoroughly enjoyed doing the exercises in the School Hall or in their classrooms.



Mr Newby, Grandad of Wilfred and Matilda, proud owner of a **1923 Alvis 12/40**, drove his magnificent antique vehicle right onto our school ground on Friday last week. The reason? To share a piece of **automotive history** with our children! He was on his way to do the Kop Hill Climb on Saturday in celebration of the car being 100 years old. The 1923 Alvis 12/40, with its elegant curves and timeless design, was like a living museum piece, you could see the awe and excitement in the children's eyes and staff, too! The children discussed when the first motor car was invented, back in 1880's, and the differences between the Alvis and modern cars today. Mrs Pitt even let the children sit in the driver's seat (with her supervision, of course),

#### What have we been learning in school?

In **Robins'** second lesson of their **'Superheroes'** topic in **Art**, the children were thinking about emotions. They began by making faces in their pairs, that they felt represented different emotions. Then they drew and coloured their own page of emojis, labelling them with the emotion they were representing.



In **Geography** Topic this week, the children in **Robins Class** were thinking about the continents of the world. They were introduced to an atlas and spent some time looking at all the maps with 2 challenges in mind: finding other countries in Europe and finding the countries closest to the continent of Antarctica. the main focus of their **'Cold, Cold'** weather topic.



This week in Maths lessons, the children in Nightingales Class have been learning how to count forward and backward from any given number up to 10. The children have also practised recognising numbers as words by playing fun games. They are now ready to move on to consolidate the correct number formation and begin to write numbers as word. Please continue to support your child, focusing on these basic skills at home.





**PEACE**- Next week we will focus on the related value of **Play**. The children in their classes will discuss and reflect on "How do you feel when you make time to play? What about when you haven't had a chance to play?" Perhaps you can have further discussions with your child/ren at home and ask your child/ren – 'What is your favourite game to play? Why? How does playing it make you feel?? You may also want to explore the meaning of this quote '*It's the things we play with and the people who help us play that make a great difference in our lives*.' - Fred Rogers, American TV personality (1928 – 2003).
