Dear Parents/Carers,

A very warm welcome back to the new school year to everyone – and a special welcome to all the children and families who have joined us for the first time. We wish them all happiness and success during their time with us at WSL. I am glad to say that we have had a very busy start to the new academic year. The children have returned to school happily, they are smartly dressed, polite, positive and eager to learn. As I write, the school is buzzing with excited learners! In our first Whole School Assembly on Wednesday this week, we shared our high expectations with the children. At WSL, our School Values underpin everything we do, we promote a simple message: **Only our best will do!** Democracy is an integral part of the school life. This week we also had Class and House Assemblies, children have had their voices heard and elected New School Council and New House Captains following their well-prepared speeches, various class monitors were nominated, too. Children in Year 6 have gone through the recruitment process by completing the Peer Mediator Application / Nomination Form. 10 children were selected and received Peer Mediation Training on Thursday this week. They are all excited to be able to provide such service to their peers and want to do their best to help others and make a difference. All children are encouraged to have ownership of their learning and take on responsibilities within the school. Please read on to see the various roles and jobs Year 6 children have in their final year at WSL. They all enjoy these responsibilities as they appreciate being treated as mature and responsible young people.

#### **Summer School Improvement Projects**

Over the summer holidays, the school has again been a hive of activity as contractors, engineers, electricians and our premise staff as well as teaching staff have been busy...

- Replacing the oil tank with a brand new air source heat pump as part of the government funded Public Sector
  Decarbonisation Scheme for schools. This project has been managed by RBWM Building Services and the whole project
  will be completed by the end of September 2023, ready for the cold winter months
- Installing a new fence to secure the new heat pump on the ground
- Installing brand new radiators in Owls and Robins Classrooms with higher capacity units, achieving the required heating capacity
- Deep cleaning and polishing floor in the Dining Room
- Deep cleaning the kitchen by a professional company
- Topping up the Adventure Playground with fresh safe play bark
- Mowing the lawns, trimming hedges etc

Our indoor and outdoor learning environment definitely looks even smarter, ready for the new term. Children can enjoy exploring, learning and playing in a tidy, calm, spacious and stimulating environment and strive to do better!























I would like to take this opportunity to thank our teaching staff for their incredible hard work over the summer making your child's start to the school year as smooth and productive as it has been. I know that you know how much goes on behind the scenes, but it's always worth reiterating the amount of time, effort, commitment and passion that the Teachers, Teaching Assistants and Support Staff at the school put in to make Waltham St Lawrence the great place it is.

As we are at the start of the new academic year, I have communicated with you via letters or emails regarding our high expectations for the children. Please refer to the letter sent home for details. Here are some reminders:

- It is very important that your child attends school every day when they are fit and well. This year we have a school attendance target of 97% for pupils. Pupils with attendance of less than 90% are regarded by the Government as having Persistent Absence and pupils with attendance in danger of falling to this level will be invited into school for support and an action plan.
- No pupils should be in school before 8.30am for supervision reasons, except for those who attend Breakfast Club starting at 7.45am.
- School Gates open at 8:30am. Pupils arriving after 8.40am are LATE and their parents need to report to the School Office and sign in the 'Late Arrival Book'.
- Please label everything e.g. School Uniform, PE Kit, Reading Bags and Water bottles and remember NO pencil cases are required, we will provide all necessary stationery for children etc.
- Children must have their PE kit in school every day, not just PE days. They also need to ensure that they have adequate
  long sleeve tops and tracksuits once the weather turns colder. Please use a drawstring bag for their PE kit. NO rucksacks
  are allowed.
- Please provide your child with healthy snacks e.g. fruit or vegetables and fresh water. If your child chooses to have
  packed lunch, we encourage parents to make healthy packed lunches. Fizzy drinks, sweets or sticky fruit winders should
  not be included (fresh or dry fruit only.)
- As from September 2023, School meal will cost £2.36. Please remember to **order school lunch for your child via Scopay before midnight!** If you forget to order your child a meal you will need to bring in a packed lunch.
- It is really important to **read daily with your child and discuss the book with them**. Please write quality feedback or any comments and sign the Reading Record or Homework Diary to let us know how that is going.
- If someone other than yourself or your nominated person(s) will be collecting your child, please tell a member of staff. We cannot release your child to anyone who has not been authorised.
- September is the time of year where we update our school records. It is essential that we have accurate records of all of the children in the school including addresses and contact numbers and emails in case of emergency, so please can you inform the School Office of any changes to your contact details as soon as possible.

May I also remind you that we operate an 'Open Door' policy and as such parents are most welcome to come and discuss any concerns with a member of staff or myself. However, at busy times, it may be necessary to make an appointment via the School Office. Similarly, if you have any comments to make regarding the school, please do let me know as I am on the playground at the end of the school day or at the Drop Off time and I am available to talk to parents or see me by making an appointment through the School Office.

At WSL we use **The Big Think SMSC Values Programme** to deliver RSHE Curriculum. The Value for this term is **Peace**. We will focus on one related value each week: **Belonging, Solitude, Play, Growth, Resilience** and **Joy**.

Next week we will be looking at the value of **Belonging**. The children in their classes will discuss and reflect on "Do you feel you belong in many places?" Perhaps you can have further discussions with your child/ren at home and ask your child/ren – 'What makes you feel belong? Why is it important to feel you belong? You may also want to explore the meaning of this quote 'Not belonging is a terrible feeling. It feels awkward and it hurts, as if you were wearing someone else's shoes.'— Phoebe Stone, author (1947- present)

**Welcome and Meet the Teacher Information Meetings for Parents** will be taking place in your child's classroom on **Wednesday 13**<sup>th</sup> **September.** Each class teacher will run two sessions: **3.20 – 4.00pm with a repeat at 4.05-4.45pm**. ## **Year 2 Swimming Lessons**

# **Nut /Dairy/Food Allergy**

Please could we remind all parents to keep us informed about any food allergies or food intolerances that your children may have. We do have children and adults in school who have nut allergies, so please could we remind you that we are a nut free school and ask all parents to continue to be vigilant and not bring any nuts or nut products on to the school site. Children are not allowed to share food with each other to avoid any incidents. Thank you for your support.

# **Medicine in School**

Please could all parents note that only prescribed medication should be brought into school and handed in to the School Office. If your child requires a **prescribed medicine** FOUR times a day, and a dose has to be administered at lunchtime, then **parents must complete a Request Form for Administration of Medicine**. Without this we are unable to administer medicine. These forms are available from the School Office. The medicine must be in the original labelled bottle/container.

If your child requires a **prescribed medicine** THREE times a day then there is normally no need for them to be given that medicine at school. The medicine can be given before school, after school when the child returns home and in the evening.

**Asthma:** Even if your child has not been diagnosed with asthma but has been given an inhaler (for any reason) then please inform the School Office. Many thanks for your support in this matter.
