Dear Parents/Carers,

We have had another busy week. Once again, the **Open Morning** on Wednesday this week went really well. We had quite a few prospective parents coming to see the school in action. They were very impressed with children's learning behaviour and we have received some very positive feedback / comments from our visitors.

Through our PSHE/Values Curriculum and School Improvement Plan (SIP), we continue our focus on developing children's understanding of our School Values Love, Truth, Peace, Responsibility and Community and linking these to Habit of the Month and the wider British Values we teach at school. We also provide a variety of opportunities and experiences for children to develop their CONFIDENCE, RESILIENCE and INDEPENDENCE. We are embedding the children's use of these terms in everyday conversation and our learners are finding how many aspects of our school learning values transcend into lots of aspects of life, not just academic learning. We appreciate your support in continuing to embed these values with your children and would ask that, where applicable, you discuss these when talking to them at home.

This year one of our focused curriculum areas has been on **improving children's writing skills through reading**. We cannot emphasise enough how important it is for your child/ren to read and be read to every day. It is our expectation that every child reads every evening without any distraction for 10-30 minutes as age appropriate as part of their home learning. Please support us by ensuring that there is a time set aside every evening for your child/ren to read, read for pleasure/ information and discuss what they have read. To be a good writer, children need to be a good reader who can read easily, fluently and with good understanding; develop the habit of reading widely and acquire a wide vocabulary etc. We use reading as a bridge to improve children's writing. In school we teach children to **'read as a writer'** and ask them to think about how the writer has created that effect and what techniques they can learn and apply. Working together, we can help children enjoy reading, writing and become good writers. Thank you for your continued support. You learn to write better by reading. You learn to read better by writing. Reading and writing work together to improve your ability to think!



Next week from 13th to 17th November is **National Anti-Bullying Week**. The theme for Anti-Bullying Week is **'Make a NOISE about Bullying**. We will plan different activities to help children understand the definition of bullying, what we mean by 'banter' and think about the difference between 'banter' and bullying. We will urge everyone to think about the role 'banter' plays in bullying and how we can tackle it. We are encouraging everyone to be mindful of how, sometimes, these banter/ jokes may not be received as they were intended.

Together, we can make a difference and take a stand against bullying. **Anti-Bullying Week** is a great opportunity for us all to get involved and raise awareness of how our school protect children from bullying. As parents/carers, teachers and governors, we each have a unique and important role to play. It's important that we all work together to have discussions about what bullying means to us, how banter can turn into something more hurtful, and what we can do to stop bullying and create safe environment for our children to thrive.



Friday 17th November is BBC Children in Need Day. This national event supports hundreds of charities that help children in a myriad of different ways. This year, in exchange for a **donation of £1** towards the Children in Need Charity appeal, children can come to school dressed in their normal School Uniform with yellow or 'SPOTtacular' accessories for this special occasion. All the money raised will be gratefully received to help change the lives of disadvantaged children and young people across the UK

What have we been learning in school?

As part of their Art topic work, children in Skylarks Class were inspired by the work of William Morris, a famous British textile designer. They designed and created their own printing stamps to produce repeating patterns.







Next week we will focus on th value of **Pride**. Children will be exploring the differences and similarities and how unique they all are, by the end of the week through stories or debate and role plays they will gain confidence about their changing bodies and appearances and learn to be proud of what their body can do. Perhaps you can have a discussion at home and spend some time with your child exploring the meaning of the quote: 'A person may be proud without being vain. We expect children to follow instructions straightaway. This is part of daily routines, please continue to support us by having high expectations for your child/ren and helping them all form good habits. Thank you.

Reading

Practice Reading! **TWI** – read **T**o, read **W**ith and have your child read Independently every evening. Daily practice is a key factor for fluency and comprehension. Daily practice also gives children exposure to new vocabulary and more complex sentence structure that help with their speaking and writing skills. Thank you.
