What have we been learning in school?



Since Term 2 children in **Owls Class** started their **Balanceability** lessons! At first, they worked on their core strength, wearing their helmets properly and learning how to handle the balance bikes correctly. They had great fun learning to manoeuvre the bikes. All the children have already showed some pleasing progress and are looking forward to their next lesson already!

In **Maths** the children in **Nightingales Class** have been learning the concept of subtractions by using different methods: Taking away and crossing out. These sessions were facilitated by using different types of manipulatives such as Numicons and Ten Frames to cater for the pupil's different learning styles. The children used reasoning and previous learnt skills to solve words problems including missing numbers. It would be great if you could help consolidate children's understanding of this concept at home with real life problems.





This week our school was buzzing with excitement as the children embarked on a literary adventure at the **Scholastic Book Fair**. The event brought joy and enthusiasm as children eagerly explored the world of books at the Book Fair.
