Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you all had a relaxing and enjoyable October Holiday filled with lots of fun, family time and, of course, reading. It was lovely to see the children return so positively to school on Tuesday, looking refreshed and ready for another eventful term in the run up to Christmas. We have arranged a wide variety of learning experiences for the children this term, these include Anti-Bullying Week, Dance lessons with a specialist dance teacher for Skylarks and Red Kites Classes and the annual Christmas festivities in December. I am very much looking forward to welcoming you back into school for our traditional events and celebrating this magical time of year with everyone in our school community. Please look out for the letters inviting you to Nativity, Christingle Service and other Christmas events.

As we start a new term, here are some reminders:

- In order to **develop self-help skills and independence** of all children, we would ask parents / all children to use Stop and Drop Service and encourage children to take responsibility to look after their own belongings, carry their own bags and lunchboxes etc. Please support us and let them do things that they can do themselves.
- Children must have their **PE kit in school every day**, not just PE days. They also need to ensure that they have adequate long sleeve tops and tracksuits as the weather turns colder. Please ensure items are **clearly labelled with your child's name and class**.
- School Lunch Order must be completed by midnight each day and paid for using SCOPAY. This ensures that the catering team is able to produce the correct number of meals, to speed up service and avoid causing stress in children due to lunch not being ordered for them that day. If your order is not completed on time, then please bring a packed lunch for your child that day.
- Winter Uniform As we are now entering the colder months that children are now expected to be in winter uniform. The uniform guideline is available via the School Website.
- There is still a lot of lost property left behind every day WITHOUT NAMES! In order to reduce the amount of property your child misplaces in school, we ask parents to ensure that **all children's belongings are clearly NAMED** so that lost property can be returned to their owners easily. We thank you for your help in this matter.
- When sleep is abundant, minds flourish. We often notice some of our children are just so tired...The impact that poor sleeping patterns can have on a child's (and adult's) ability to concentrate and learn is remarkable. Please make sure your child goes to bed at an appropriate time. If you are having difficulties establishing these good patterns of sleeping with your child, please come to see us.

On the **Inset Day** on Monday teachers and teaching assistants spent time together to discuss our School Improvement Plan focusing on our ethos of educating the 'Whole Child' and the importance of instilling in children the values which will prepare them for life in Modern Britain. We discussed the make-up of our school and how we can all work together and adopt a solution-focused approach to cater for the needs of all children and achieve the best outcomes for each and every child at WSL.

Staff discussed and agreed actions we need to take to achieve the objectives as set in our **School Improvement Plan (SIP) 2023-24**. Our School Improvement Plan (SIP) is driven by our School Mission Statement which reflects what we believe and do and what we aspire to achieve and also based on School Self Evaluation, Performance Data and external views etc. The aim of this plan is to not only maintain our Outstanding standard in all areas but also to build upon it and improve the school further. Bikeability Training - Children in Year 6 have thoroughly enjoyed their 3-day Bikeability Cycle Training at Level 2/3 this week. They all followed instructions carefully and practised some basic skills on the playground and learned more about how to ride their bikes safely by keeping some distance. They then cycled out on the roads around the village and learned all about how to cycle safely on the roads. For some children this was a completely new and slightly daunting experience. Nevertheless, they have overcome their anxiety and are now better prepared to cycle. They have become more

confident and are reminded to remember the key safety rule – See and BE Seen. The instructors were very impressed with the children's energy and enthusiasm and how polite and sensible all children are despite the wet weather! Well done, children! Thank you, parents, for giving permission for the children to come on the course. We would like to offer our thanks to John and Taran and RBWM for kindly providing this invaluable training.





What have we been learning in school?

This week has been Halloween Week in **Owls Class**! The children have been scarily busy this week, working on a range of skills! They have been practising their fine motor and segmenting skills using spaghetti worms, working on their number recognition by pulling numbers out in a spider web, practising reading pumpkin CVC words and matching to the correct picture and they have been representing numbers by sorting potion bottles into cauldrons. Nasal Flu Vaccinations - Thank You From NHS

We received a 'Thank You' Poster from NHS indicating the percentage vaccinated in relation to our cohort. Our school has achieved a low uptake, 71.6% compared to national uptake 75%. We would welcome any feedback

from you so that we can work together in the future to improve this.

School Uniform

Due to the change in weather please can we remind all parent/carers that children should be bringing a coat into school every day. We also request that long hair is tied back and only plain/blue hair accessories are worn if necessary. The only jewellery that is allowed in school are small plain earring studs and they must be removed for PE and games lessons. If your child is unable to remove their own earrings it would be advisable for them not to be worn to school on PE days.

There is a lot of lost property left behind every day WITHOUT NAMES! In order to reduce the amount of property your child misplaces in school, we ask parents to ensure that **all children's belongings are clearly NAMED** so that lost property can be returned to their owners easily.

Commitment to and Expectations for Attendance

As a school, we encourage parents to ensure that all children achieve maximum possible attendance and that any problems that prevent this are identified and acted on promptly. Regular school attendance at WSL Primary School will set pupils up for positive attendance throughout their school life. Please be aware that if holidays are taken without approval, this information will be passed to RBWM Education Welfare Officer. Taking an unauthorised holiday is a Criminal Offence and may result, depending on the circumstances of each case, in either a Penalty Notice being issued or Prosecution in the Magistrates Court. A Penalty Notice may be issued without further warning. Payment of a Penalty Notice within 21 Days is £60, between 22 and 28 days is £120. Penalty Notices are issued to each parent, per child. However, if a penalty notice is not paid then the Parents may be prosecuted in the Magistrates Court. In some cases, a Penalty Notice will not be offered at all and the matter referred immediately for Prosecution. In the Court the penalty is a fine of up to £1000 and a Criminal Record.
