Dear Parents/Carers,

Although it is only the second full week of Term 3, I am pleased to share with you that we have started the year with a determined and earnest approach and we have seen some great learning across the school. One of my highlights is going around each class, looking at the learning and progress across the school. This week I have seen some real high standard of writing, in terms of the content and presentation, from the youngest children to the top Year 6 pupils, in particular, seeing some of our youngest learners writing sentences independently. Writing is such a hard skill to master... just think about it: the development of fine motor skills allowing our learners to correctly hold a pencil, learning the letter sounds and also how to form each letter and then transferring this knowledge into forming written words by blending sounds. Not to mention the need to remember to separate words and punctuate a sentence. WOW! Learning to write is hard! However, alongside this I am so proud of how our learners have embraced our school value of having highest expectations, facing challenges and are moving themselves into their stretch zones by seeking encouragement (and feedback); reflecting on mistakes and being resilient by changing their plans based on the feedback they have received. We appreciate your support and help our learners to achieve their true potential.



A huge WELL DONE and THANK YOU to all the children in Skylarks Class for a wonderful Class Assembly on Wednesday this week. They shared what they have learned or will be learning in a range of subjects in Term 3. They spoke clearly and confidently. What fantastic reading and singing! They have indeed demonstrated some important skills. Their Tudors dance movement showed their

understanding of the period. Thank you to parents and friends for coming and we hope you enjoyed it.

#### What have we been learning in school?

In **Geography** this term, the children in **Robins Class** are learning about **Seas and Oceans**. After learning about the seas and oceans around the UK (and remembering the names of many of them during our recap), this week, we looked at Oceans around the world. They worked in pairs, throwing a pair of dice, adding up the numbers and finding the answer on their sheet. The numbers corresponded to either a continent or an ocean, which they then needed to write on the sheet. They learnt why it appears that the world has 2 Pacific Oceans in an atlas!


