Dear Parents/Carers,

What an incredible week of learning and enriching experience it has been for all the children at WSL!

This week is our Assessment Week. Class Teachers have assessed where the children are in Reading, Writing, SPaG, Maths and other aspects of the curriculum. This is an important part of teaching and learning at WSL and it enables teachers to identify gaps in children's knowledge and understanding so that teachers can plan forward to address any misconceptions and gaps and put in place any intervention programs to enable them to make further progress. At the end of Term 4, in late March, there will be another opportunity for you to formally come into school and speak to your child's Class Teachers about the progress your child/ren is/are making and how we can continue to work in partnership to provide the best for all of our learners!



On Tuesday Safer Internet Day, the children in their class groups learned about online safety through stories and activities based around the theme 'Inspiring Change? Making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online,' focusing on using the internet to make a change for the better; the changes young people want to see online and the things that can influence and change the way young people think, feel and act online and offline. The children had the opportunity to explore the responsibility they have to help keep themselves safe, attended BBC

Live Lesson on Safer Internet Day and designed their own posters. It is so important that you take the time to have a conversation with your children about what they are doing and stay engaged with your children's digital lives. 
