
Thank you to those parents who attended **Red Kites Parents Evenings** this week. We hope you enjoyed viewing your children's work and found the information you received useful and know how you can support your child/ren. If for any reason, you were not able to attend on these evenings, please do speak to Mrs Ablewhite so that another appointment can be made.

**Summer Term** is a busy term as always, with lots of events taking place: Whole School Trip, Sports Day, Transition Week, Village Summer Festival, KS2 End of Year Production 'Peter Pan', Open Evenings for Parents and our Leavers Assembly as well as PTA organised fun events etc. Please see Page 3 of this term's dates and events for your diary. You might want to spend a few moments transferring these to your diary so that you do not miss something important. There will be more information about some of the events in future newsletters / letters.

We continue to be committed to 'Outstanding' standards in all areas and promote confidence, independence, resilience and hard work. Through our embedded Growth Mindset approach, the children understand that in order to learn they must be brave and not afraid of making mistakes, and this allows them to tackle challenges they would not have attempted before. As Teachers and Teaching Assistants, we never stop learning and the school provides opportunities for all staff to have Continuous Professional Development (CPD) linked to the school priorities and national initiatives. This term we carry on further developing our learner's Metacognitive Skills and Self-Regulated Learning Approach, teaching children to apply the strategy of 'Plan, Monitor and Evaluate' as part of the learning process. This will empower the children to become effective and independent learners. As part of our CPD, this year we have signed up for RBWM 'Walkthrus' Programme led by Tom Sherrington. Over the last few months, we have been using a cluster of specific teaching techniques in our teaching and learning. These strategies have not only helped refine our teaching but also made a difference to getting children more engaged in their learning, hence maximising children's progress. You may have observed the techniques being implemented by Class Teachers when you attended our Open Sessions such as *Think Pair Share* or *Say It Again Better* etc. We value your great support and partnership in all that we do.

## What have we been learning in school?

In Maths, children in Kestrels Class have been learning how to collect and present data using a range of graphs and charts. They carried out a survey on a topic of their choice, collecting preferences for all members of the class, before presenting their results using a pie chart. In order to produce their pie chart, they had to correctly calculate the angle required for each sector and then measure and draw the angles correctly using a protractor. The children also produced a key for the sectors of their pie chart to make it clear and simple to interpret. They thoroughly enjoyed the lesson, developing effective communication and practising lots of different practical skills.















This week in **Geography**, children in **Nightingales Class** have started their new topic on **Our Local Area**. The children carried out a short walk around the school. They are able to locate where their school is on an aerial photograph and can recognise some key features in the surrounding areas. They have also created maps of School Road, West End based on their observations. Here are some examples of children's work.

















For our Relationship and Health Education Curriculum this term via **The Big Think**, we will be focusing on the Core Value of **Community** and its related values of **Conservation**, **Helping Our World**, **Global Connections**, **Unity**, **Forgiveness**, **Caring Citizen and Kindness to Others**. At the assembly on Monday, we introduced the first related value of **Conservation**. We will spend two weeks on each related value this term. Next week we will continue with **Saving Clothing/Responsible Consumption**. Children in their class will have a discussion on this topic and are encouraged to think about 'Where does an item of your clothing come from? What will you do with it when you've finished with it?' If we all make a small change, then we can have a big impact on our planet. Let's all try to be responsible consumers and Reduce, Reuse and Recycle more.

You may want to spend some time at home with your child/ren exploring the meaning of this quote "There is no such thing as away. When you throw something away, it must go somewhere.' — Annie Leonard, Executive Director of Green Peace USA (1964 -) What might this quote mean?
