Dear Parents/Carers,

Thank you for attending the **Welcome and Year Ahead Information Meetings** for Parents on Tuesday. We hope you have found these meetings useful and informative. We were so pleased to see so many of you and happy that these meetings provided an important opportunity for you to come and meet your child/ren's Class Teacher, see their learning environment and also learn more about our whole school and class focuses including individual class routines and information about the curriculum. We have not introduced anything new in terms of systems or high expectations underpinned by our School Values and Ethos, the Whole Child Education and Growth Mindset. We simply want to ensure that the systems we use truly help us to implement what we believe is right for our learners. We seek to engage our parents in the promotion of developing good habits and effective learning behaviours for all the children. At the meetings each Class Teacher emphasised our high expectations and shared our School Values and Golden Rules. Here are some key points from the meeting:

- The importance of developing good habits in children through our daily routines and our Habit of the Month
- Focus on developing children's **metacognitive learning strategies** e.g. learn to learn by activating their prior knowledge, building long term memories and acquire positive learning behavior's e.g. independence, reflection, application etc.
- Home Learning in support of the above, focusing on: Reading and practice of key age-appropriate skills, basic facts e.g. number bonds, times table etc. in order to increase the fluency of learners' application of these skills in their learning; Aid rapid retrieval to support learners' automaticity when applying key, age appropriate skills and knowledge; Preparation for learning in class by ensuring all children have a solid understanding of key knowledge and skills.
- Supporting your child's daily reading and checking their understanding. Reading at KS2 there is **a key text** or **class book** which children will be studying in depth to develop their literacy skills, reading strategies and comprehension etc. which will help them with their writing skills.
- In our school we promote **Growth Mindset** and embrace failure/mistakes and see this as essential for learning. Learning is a journey of discovery and the progression of skills and knowledge and developing mastery in these. Good learning is hard work and mistakes or failure are part of learning. Ensuring our children have the resilience and tenacity to learn from these mistakes and be successful is vital. We encourage risk taking, celebrating mistakes, praise effort and inspire our all children to always Do their Best and Be the Best.

We would appreciate your full support of our school procedures, policies and your partnership as outlined in Home School Agreement. Without that partnership it will not be possible for our learners to fulfil their potential. Quite simply, we want the best for your child in exactly the same way you do. Together we can achieve that goal! For those who were unable to attend the meeting, please can you read and sign the Home School Agreement and return a signed copy to school next week. Thank you.



Peer Mediation I am pleased to inform you that our Peer Mediation Service will start next week. The aim of Peer Mediation is



for 'peers' to help resolve low-level conflict within the school playground using mediation. Over the past few years, we have seen Peer Mediation having had a huge impact on the school, not just in the development of skills the children have in being able to deal with conflict but also in building their confidence and capacity to take those skills and use them throughout life. Peer Mediation Training took place on Wednesday this week. Children in Year 6 have gone through the recruitment process by completing the Peer Mediator Application / Nomination Form. 10

children were selected and received training. They are all excited to be able to provide such service to their peers and want to do their best to help others and make a difference. Support is always at hand for our Peer Mediators. They will have regular meetings with Mrs Clark to discuss any areas with which our Peer Mediators require some support. This Wednesday, **Team GB Paralympian Ben Fox** visited our school to inspire and motivate the children. Ben, a Paralympic basketball player born without his right leg, first spoke to the children in Skylarks Class before addressing the whole school in a heartwarming assembly. The children were captivated as Ben shared his personal journey, from overcoming challenges related to his disability to celebrating his recent triumph of winning a Silver Medal at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games. His story of resilience, teamwork and perseverance deeply touched and inspired all the children. Ben also emphasised the powerful message of **Equal Play** as part of Equal Play Campaign, reinforcing the importance of inclusivity in sports and life, regardless of physical limitations. He encouraged the children to pursue their dreams, just as he and his team continue to chase their ultimate goal of winning gold in future Paralympic Games. Both children and staff were eager to ask questions, all of which Ben answered thoughtfully. His visit left a lasting impression, reminding us all of the importance of determination, equality, and the pursuit of excellence. Ben is truly an inspiration to everyone who had the privilege of hearing him speak. We have already invited Ben to come back to see us again in the future and he has agreed! 
