Dear Parents/Carers,

We are certainly into the full swing of things this academic year, with the school organising a range of learning activities for the children, what a packed week of learning, please read on to find out more...

This year we have made some exiting changes to our lunchtime activities. Now the children have the freedom to choose from a variety of activities during their lunch hour. We all know play is essential for learning important life skills that may not be taught in a classroom. This structured free choice arrangement helps our children develop a wide range of 'soft' or 'life' skills, including cooperation, imagination, initiative, collaboration, resilience, problem solving and risk-taking.

We are thrilled to see the children thoroughly enjoying this independent and active hour. Our Year 6 Playground Leaders assist in setting up a carousel of activities for all children to choose from and enjoy every day. We are delighted to report that every child is happy and fully engaged with their games and activities such as skipping, LEGO, giant Connect 4, Snake and Ladders, building blocks, hula hoops and table tennis etc.. The quality of play has improved even further.

What have we been learning in school?

As part of our Harvest theme and to build upon their prior learning on Plants last term, on Wednesday this week, the children in Robins Class had an exciting visit to Waltham Place. The highlight of their trip was **making soda bread** from scratch. Guided by Nick and our staff, the children mixed the ingredients, kneaded the dough and watched in awe as their bread baked to perfection. The children enjoyed the fruits of their labour, spreading delicious jam on their freshly baked soda bread. The children learned about the origins of their food. From the wheat to the kitchen, the children took part in **flour milling**, gaining a deeper understanding of where the flour comes from.

The visit to Waltham Place Farm was a memorable and enriching experience. Here are what the children say about their day and some photos for you to enjoy.
