Dear Parents/Carers,

We were so pleased to see so many of you join us in celebrating the Harvest Festival last Friday at WSL Church. The Harvest Assembly is always a treat, particularly this one being the first whole school celebration of this academic year! The theme of our Harvest Festival is based on the following values: Gratitude and Appreciation. Through poems, songs, storytelling and Harvest Art. The children reminded us of all the good things we have in our lives and how we can all share with those who are not so fortunate. There is nothing more joyful than hearing the children singing beautifully, speaking with confidence and clarity. A huge thank you goes to our Year 6 children for leading our Harvest Service so wonderfully and teachers and TAs who have worked tirelessly behind the scenes to prepare the children and make the service such a success. Thank you for your generosity for all the donations! The food has been delivered to the Local Foodbank. We would also like to thank Revd. Andy Ferguson for stepping in to support us and parents who helped transport or walk the children to the church.



We have had another busy and successful week. Yesterday morning we held our second **Open Morning** to prospective parents and many prospective parents took the opportunity to visit our school and see teaching and learning in action. Visitors thoroughly enjoyed the tour and the presentation. They were very impressed with our School Values and children's learning behaviour and commented on how engaged they all are with their tasks and what a lovely calm, purposeful learning atmosphere the school has.



On Wednesday this week, we welcomed **Invictus Games Competitor Nerys Pearce** to our school. Nerys led an exciting **Sponsored Fitness Circuit** with all children, followed by an inspirational talk. The children participated in four challenging fitness activities with enthusiasm and enjoyment. They

also supported each other, cheering on every achievement, demonstrating outstanding teamwork. After the fitness circuit, Nerys shared her inspirational life story, with children acting as soldiers and downhill skiers! She also talked about her recent achievements, including winning 43 global medals and holding 7 current world records. Her message 'Push yourself forward' in the face of challenges aligns perfectly with our School Values and the experience children had is one that they will never forget! Nerys left seven special Great Athletes wristbands which will be awarded to children in each year group who have pushed themselves forward this week.

The theme for this year's **World Values Day** is **Bringing Values to Life**. In school children in each class have thought carefully and chose their own values and put them into action. Red Kites chose '**Kindness'** and they have worked together to make a real difference. Values are for acting on! Let's all put our school or your chosen values into action day in and day out. If we can do this, we can make a difference.

What have we been learning in school?

As part of their Science topic of 'Light', this week Year 3 children in Skylarks Class were looking at 'Making shadows'. For their task, the brief was to choose a fabric for a new pair of curtains for a baby's room, to prevent her from waking up and crying too early! To do this, they had to test a number of fabrics and papers to see which were transparent, which were translucent and which were opaque. They did this by shining a torch at each one and looking at how dense the shadow was i.e. how much light they blocked out. Maybe you could ask them, at home, if they can remember those three scientific words they learned?
