Our Year 5 and 6 children are having a fantastic time on their residential trip at **Osmington Bay** this week! The instructors have been thoroughly impressed with the children's exemplary behaviour - they have been respectful, polite, well-mannered, while also demonstrating great resilience and courage. We are incredibly proud of them all!

What have we been learning in school?



The children In Robins Class have been learning about fact family and the relationship between numbers. This is a set of calculations of Maths facts that use the same set of three numbers. Working in pairs, the children started to explore these facts by using manipulatives placed on a Part-Whole Model and verbally to say a related number sentence. After that they were encouraged to write some additions number facts and some subtractions number facts. They are now progressing and discovering the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction and use these to check calculations and solve missing number problems.



The children have also worked in pairs, mastering the art of **counting in 3s** using colourful counters. Working together not only makes learning fun but also helps them develop teamwork and communication skills. It's wonderful to see their confidence grow as they count in 3s with ease. Keep up the great work, Year 2! Perhaps you can help your child practise this new skill at home.









The children in Red Kites Class have enjoyed making umbrellas decorated with Autumnal leaves. The shape of the umbrellas was created by making 4 cones and sticking them together. After attaching a handle, the children designed their leaves and stuck them to the inside of their umbrellas. This activity has sparked their creativity and was enjoyed by all.



Reading - It is essential that every child reads every evening at home and that this is recorded in their Reading Record or Homework Diary which is returned to school every day. Daily reading is vital in supporting our learners to become fluent readers who develop a love of books. Reading is the most crucial skill any child will learn. It literally opens doors for all and will enable our learners to pursue any future career they choose. It is our school's clear expectation that every child reads for at least 10 minutes for EYFS/KS1 children and 20 minutes for KS2 children every night without any distraction. Please support us by ensuring that there is a time set aside every evening to ensure your child can read and, ideally, to be read to by an adult. Reading is one of the greatest gifts you can give children! Thank you for your continued support.



Next week we will be looking at the value of **Contentment**. The children in their classes will discuss and reflect on what helps them and when they are able to feel happy and content. KS2 children will explore what **feelings** would help them feel contentment, covering how important friendships are in making us feel happy and secure, and how people choose and make friends. Children will be given time to have Self-reflection: Have you ever felt satisfied or content with yourself after trying something difficult? You may also want to explore the meaning of this quote *'Contentment, is when you can say to yourself, "Oh yes - I already have everything that I really need.'* - 14th Dalai Lama, Tibetan Buddhist Monk (1935-)

School Uniform

Due to the change in weather please can we remind all parent/carers that children should be bringing a coat into school every day. We also request that long hair is tied back and only plain/blue hair accessories are worn if necessary. The only jewellery that is allowed in school are small plain earring studs and they must be removed for PE and games lessons. If your child is unable to remove their own earrings it would be advisable for them not to be worn to school on PE days.

PLEASE LABEL EVERYTHING

There is still some lost property left behind every day WITHOUT NAMES! In order to reduce the amount of property your child misplaces in school, we ask parents to ensure that all children's belongings are clearly NAMED so that lost property can be returned to their owners easily.

Safe Entry and Exit Reminder

Children should enter and exit the school premises exclusively through the blue pedestrian gate in front of the school main building. The staff car park gate is NOT a safe entry or exit point for children, especially during the busy end-of-day traffic when cars are leaving the car park. Thank you for your support in this matter.

Expectation for Morning Drop-Off

As we enter October, we would expect the children from Year 1 to Year 6 to come to school independently. We are impressed that some of Reception children are already coming in independently — WELL DONE. Please say good bye to your child at the entrance gate or use Stop and Drop Zone and let your child/ren walk into the school by themselves. This will encourage children to develop self-help skills and independence and settle in quickly to the day ahead. Thank you for your support.
