#### What have we been learning in school?



Since Term 2 children in **Owls Class** started their **Balanceability** lessons! At first, they worked on their core strength, wearing their helmets properly and learning how to handle the balance bikes correctly. They had great fun learning to manoeuvre the bikes. All the children have already showed some pleasing progress and are looking forward to their next lesson already!



This week, our **Year 4 children** explored reflective materials in their **Science** lessons. comparing the reflective properties of a range of materials such as tin foil, mirrors, high visibility fabric and paper to find out which material is most reflective and why. They demonstrated great enthusiasm and diligence as they conducted their experiments and record their results. Their hard work and curiosity were truly commendable. Well done, Year 4! Last Wednesday, as part of their English and topic work on **Rivers**, **Kestrels Class** welcomed Mr Patterson and his colleague Mr Ferey from Thames Water. They delivered an engaging and informative session on the importance of water, sparking curiosity and excitement among the children. The children explored fascinating topics, including:

- The Water Cycle
- How water is treated
- Water shortages around the world

Did you know that, on average, we use 33 buckets of water a day, while in sub-Saharan Africa, people use only six? This stark contrast highlighted the value of conserving water. The children also learned practical tips for saving water and the importance of "Bin it, don't block it!" to help protect our water systems. They were full of curiosity, asking many insightful questions, and were captivated by the "wonderful world of water." Additionally, the children had fun trying on Thames Water helmets and high-visibility jackets, adding a hands-on element to their learning experience. A huge thank you to Mr Patterson and Mr Ferey for such an inspiring visit! A special thanks to Mrs Patterson for coordinating this event.





Next week we will be looking at **Trust** (KS1) and Integrity (KS2). Children will be listening to stories, discussing and reflecting on 'How trusting are you?' or 'Have you ever believed in something that was too good to be true? How might you have checked the facts first?' Perhaps you can have a discussion at home and spend some time with your child exploring the meaning of the quote: *"Love all, trust a few, do wrong to none.'* - William Shakespeare, English poet, playwright (1564 - 1616). What might this quote mean? Let us try to live our lives with integrity. Have the patience to build up trust, have the courage to face the truth.
