Dear Parents/Carers,

It was so good to see so many of you attending the **Parents' Evenings** with your children and contributing to the discussions about your child's learning with their Class Teachers. We believe that working in partnership is key in ensuring your child's success and we are always looking to give you the information that you find most useful to help your child's progress and overall development, such as how we can work together to help children form good habits and acquire basic life skills to become more effective, independent learners. We hope you found the discussions with your child's direct involvement very valuable. If for any reason, you were not able to attend on either of the specified nights, please do speak to your child's Class Teacher to arrange a mutually convenient appointment. If you have any feedback for us, both positive and developmental, please let us know.

Once again children have enjoyed a variety of learning opportunities offered to them this week:

On Wednesday, the **Berkshire Fire Rescue Team** visited our school and delivered an engaging and informative session on **Fire Safety** to the children in Red Kites Class. The children learned how to prevent fire at home and some simple safety techniques to extinguish a fire on the body and clothing. They learned the crucial fire safety technique known as "Stop, Drop, and Roll." This method is used to extinguish flames on the body and is easy to remember:

- 1. **Stop**: Immediately stop moving to prevent the flames from spreading.
- 2. **Drop**: Drop to the ground and cover your face with your hands to protect it.
- 3. **Roll**: Roll back and forth on the ground until the flames are extinguished.

They also understood the importance of closing doors and windows to prevent the spread of smoke and airflow during a fire. The firefighters extended their visit to the children in Skylarks and KS1, where they provided an insightful talk and a tour of their fire engine. The children were thrilled to see all the essential tools and equipment used by the firefighters in their daily duties. Overall, the children thoroughly enjoyed the experience and gained a wealth of knowledge about fire safety. We are grateful to the Berkshire Fire Rescue Team for their time and dedication in educating our children on such an important topic.





I enjoyed learning about fire safety, how to test smoke alarms and what they use in an emergency. I found it very interesting that they said their cookies and biscuits was the most important part because it kept them going during the night. My favorite parts were when they turned on the siren and lights, my second favourite part was when they got 2 hula hoops down from a tree.-Sophie I thought it was an amazing experience! If your clothes set on fire you have to stop, drop and roll. It was also fun because they got the hula-hoop off the tree with the hose. I loved it!! The fire officers were amazing. - Florentina

I enjoyed seeing the hula-hoops get out of the tree by the huge hose! I also enjoyed hearing the sirens as the fire fighters drive the fire engine out of the playground. I learned about the smoke alarm and how to get out of your room if there is a fire in it. Tonight I'm going to check my smoke alarms and make sure they work! (thank you fire officers!) - Grace

We learnt what RTC stands for – Road Traffic Collision. They took the hoops off the tree and made everyone cheer. They told us what they do and what their tools are used for. we learned a lot! – Ethan


I think the fireman's trip was educational and fun. Zamin tried the fireman's suit on and it fitted him. - Toby

What have we been learning in school?

This week, children in **Owls Class** our have been focusing on their topic **Halloween**! They have had a lot of Halloween fun by making sound shapes using spaghetti worms, tuning their fine motor skills by using tweezers to pick out the sounds from the spider's web, and using sensory materials to help practise their letter formation. They have also had a blast dressing up in their favourite costumes and sharing spooky stories. The children have been incredibly engaged and excited throughout all these activities!



During KS2 RE Week, children in each class delved into unique and fascinating topics. Children in **Skylarks Class** explored the concept of **Pilgrimages**, learning about the journeys people take to sacred places and the significance behind these travels. One of the highlights was when Eshal brought a prayer mat to share with the class, providing a tangible example of traditional costumes and prayer mat used in worship practices. In **Red Kites Class**, the focus was on **Worship**, where children discovered various forms of worship practices across different religions and their importance in daily life. Meanwhile, the **Kestrels Class** dived into **Creation Stories**, examining how different cultures and religions explain the origins of the world and humanity. Through these activities, the children developed a better understanding of these concepts and engaged in deep reflections related to daily life. The week was packed with engaging discussions and reflections, making it a memorable and enriching experience for all the children. Here are just a few examples of children's work.





Children in **Robins Class** finished the week by creating their own bookmarks using autumn leaves they personally selected, each choosing a leaf they felt represented them best. Reminder:

- Parking and Safety We kindly ask all parents to avoid parking in restricted Zones i.e. the Zigzag 'Keep Clear' Zone and Stop and Drop Zone in front of the school. These areas are designated to warn motorists that stopping here could endanger children and pedestrians and to ensure there is enough space for vehicles, including the School Bus, to drive in and out safely. Parking in these zones can cause accidents and block other parents from using our Stop and Drop system. We also remind parents to use the designated Stop and Drop zone and not to let your children out of the car in the middle of the road. We have helpers manning the Stop and Drop Zone every day to assist your child safely out of the car. There is no need for parents to get out of the car as our Volunteer Parent Helpers will open the car door and assist your child safely. Let's work together to keep our school environment safe for everyone.
- Encouraging Independence for Owls Class Parents of children in Owls class are reminded to use the Stop and Drop Zone or say goodbye to their children at the main entrance. This practice helps encourage independence in our young learners. Thank you all for your cooperation and support!
- The school will be closed from Monday 28th to Friday 1st November for October Holiday and also closed on Monday 4th November for Staff Inset Day. We re-open at 8.30 for the start of Term 2 on Tuesday 5th November 2024.
