Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you all had a relaxing and enjoyable October Holiday filled with lots of fun, family time, and, of course, reading and creating videos as part of our sister school exchange programme. On that note, I would like to extend a big thank you to all the parents who have sent in their children's videos — they are truly impressive! It was wonderful to see the children return to school on Tuesday with such positivity — looking refreshed and ready for another exciting, eventful term in the run up to Christmas. This term, we have organised a wide range of enriching learning experiences for the children, including **Anti-Bullying Week**, Dance lessons with a specialist dance teacher for Skylarks and Red Kites Classes and the much-anticipated Christmas festivities in December. I am very much looking forward to welcoming you into school for our traditional events and celebrating this magical time of year with everyone in our school community. Please look out for letters inviting you to Nativity, Christingle Service and other special Christmas events.

As we start a new term, here are some reminders:

- In order to **develop self-help skills and independence** of all children, we would ask parents / all children, including children in Owls Class to use Stop and Drop Service or say goodbye to your children at the main entrance. Helpers at the Stop Drop will assist your child safely out of the car. so that they can walk to their classroom on their own. This practice helps encourage **independence** in our young learners. Children should also take responsibility by looking after their own belongings, carrying their own bags and lunchboxes etc. Please support us and let them do things that they can do themselves.
- Children must have their PE kit in school every day, not just PE days. They also need to ensure that they have adequate
 long sleeve tops and tracksuits as the weather turns colder. Please ensure ALL items are clearly labelled with your child's
 name and class.
- School Lunch Order must be completed by midnight each day and paid for using SCOPAY. This ensures that the catering team is able to produce the correct number of meals, to speed up service and avoid causing stress in children due to lunch not being ordered for them that day. If your order is not completed on time, then please bring a packed lunch for your child that day.
- Winter Uniform As we are now entering the colder months that children are now expected to be in winter uniform. The uniform guideline is available via the School Website.
- There is still a lot of lost property left behind every day WITHOUT NAMES! In order to reduce the amount of property your child misplaces in school, we ask parents to ensure that **all children's belongings are clearly NAMED** so that lost property can be returned to their owners easily. We thank you for your help in this matter.
- When sleep is abundant, minds flourish. We often notice some of our children are just so tired...The impact that poor sleeping patterns can have on a child's (and adult's) ability to concentrate and learn is remarkable. Please make sure your child goes to bed at an appropriate time. If you are having difficulties establishing these good patterns of sleeping with your child, please come to see us.

We have had another busy week. Once again, the **Open Morning** on Wednesday this week went really well. We had a few prospective parents coming to see the school in action. They were very impressed with children's learning behaviour and we have received some very positive feedback / comments from our visitors.

On the **Inset Day**, teachers and teaching assistants spent time together to discuss our **School Improvement Plan** focusing on our ethos of educating the 'Whole Child' and the importance of instilling in children the values which will prepare them for life in Modern Britain. We discussed how we can all work together and adopt a solution-focused approach to cater for the needs of all children and achieve the best outcomes for each and every child at WSL.

Staff discussed and agreed on actions needed to achieve the objectives outlined in our 2024-25 School Improvement Plan (SIP). This aim is not only to maintain our Outstanding standard across all areas but also to build upon it and improve the school further. One of the key curriculum priorities this year is to develop children's oracy and writing skills and we look forward to working in partnership with you to achieve this and our other goals for the year. Next week marks National Anti-Bullying Week and this year's theme is **'Choose Respect.' Anti-Bullying Week** is a great opportunity for all of us to come together and raise awareness about the importance of protecting our children from bullying, Let's reflect on what we can do to stop bullying

and create a safe environment where our children can thrive. Throughout the week, we have planned various activities to help our children understand what bullying is and how they can stand against it. One of the highlights will be Odd Socks Day on Tuesday 12th November. On this day, both staff and children are encouraged to wear odd socks to celebrate what makes each of us unique. Let's unite and make a difference together. By Choosing Respect, we can take a stand against bullying and ensure a supportive and inclusive environment for everyone.

What have we been learning in school?

Bikeability Training - Children in Year 6 have thoroughly enjoyed their 3-day Bikeability Cycle Training at Level 2/3 this week. They all followed instructions carefully and practised some basic skills on the playground and learned more about how to ride their bikes safely by keeping some distance. They then cycled out on the roads around the village and learned all about how to cycle safely on the roads. For some children this was a completely new and slightly daunting experience. Nevertheless, they have overcome their anxiety and are now better prepared to cycle. They have become more confident and are reminded to remember the key safety rule - See and BE Seen. The instructors were very impressed with the children's energy and enthusiasm and how polite and sensible all children are! Well done, children! Thank you, parents, for giving permission for the children to come on the course. We would like to offer our thanks to John and Fzeelah and RBWM for kindly providing this invaluable training.



Yesterday, the children in Red Kites Class had the incredible opportunity to participate in a live-streamed lesson from the Royal Ballet, broadcast directly from the Royal Opera House in Covent Garden. During this engaging session, they not only learned ballet terminology from Swan Lake, sword-fighting movements from Romeo and Juliet, and contemporary dance steps from a modern ballet called Flight Path, but also had the chance to explore the backstage departments, including costume, scenery, props, lighting, and even the armoury. They saw how these departments collaborate to create stunning ballet performances. Mrs. Macaulay Brown then taught the class the five basic ballet positions, and everyone got a close look at a pair of pointed shoes. It was a fascinating journey into the world of ballet! We are so proud of children's enthusiasm and participation!





In Term 2, we will be focusing on our Core Value of TRUTH and the related Value of Honesty, Curiosity, Hope, Optimism, Trust, Integrity, Truthfulness and Non-Judgement. This week children looked at 'Honesty' and explored whether 'honesty is always the best policy'. Next week we will be looking at Curiosity. They will be discussing and reflecting 'Has your curiosity ever driven you to fix something old or invent something new? What inspired you? How did it turn out? Perhaps you can have a discussion at home and spend some time with your child exploring the meaning of the quote: "I have no special talents. I am only passionately curious." - Albert Einstein, German physicist (1879 - 1955). What might this quote mean?

School Uniform

Due to the change in weather please can we remind all parent/carers that children should be bringing a coat into school every day. We also request that long hair is tied back and only plain/blue hair accessories are worn if necessary. The only jewellery that is allowed in school are small plain earring studs and they must be removed for PE and games lessons. If your child is unable to remove their own earrings it would be advisable for them not to be worn to school on PE days.

Parking, Speed and Safety

We kindly ask all parents to avoid parking in restricted Zones i.e. the Zigzag 'Keep Clear' Zone and Stop and Drop Zone in front of the school. Parking in these zones can cause accidents and block other parents from using our Stop and Drop system. We also remind parents to use the designated Stop and Drop zone and not to let your children out of the car in the middle of the road. We have helpers manning the Stop and Drop Zone every day to assist your child safely out of the car. There is no need for parents to get out of the car as our Volunteer Parent Helpers will open the car door and assist your child safely. We ask all drivers to slow down near schools, no speeding. Speeding in these areas can put children and others at serious risk. Let's work together to keep our school environment safe for everyone. Thank you.
