Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been an exciting week of learning, with children taking part in a variety of engaging activities. A highlight was **No Pens Day** on Wednesday, where each class explored different ways of learning without writing, focusing instead on speaking, listening and practical activities. This offered the children the chance to develop their communication skills in a fun and interactive way. Please read on to find out more about what each class have been doing, and enjoying some photos capturing the highlights of the week!

On No Pens Day, **Owls Class** contributed to a Story Circle, where the children went round and each added a line to the story. They ended up with a dragon who ate up Owls Class three times! They then acted out the traditional tale of *The Three Little Pigs*, with different children in each group taking on the roles of the characters and joining in with repeated refrains. In addition, the class engaged in some number work with Numicon, finding out the composition of numbers using part-whole models. They also worked on their memory skills and practised reading CVC words. What a busy and fun-filled day of learning!















The children in **Nightingales Class** took part in a lovely Show and Tell session, where they all brought in items that were special to them. Each child had the chance to share the story behind their chosen items, whether it was a treasured toy or something related to a personal hobby or interest. The children thoroughly enjoyed learning about their peers' favourite things and eagerly asked lots of great questions, showing genuine curiosity and interest in one another's stories. It was a wonderful opportunity for the children to practise their speaking and listening skills, while building stronger connections with their classmates, too!

The children in **Robins Class** had a fantastic opportunity to put their pens down and engage in a variety of pen-free activities, focusing on talking, listening and active participation. They practised public speaking in front of an audience, rehearsing what to write in an informal letter and had fun while doing it. The children took part in lots of "hand on learning " using Base 10 to explore the concept of subtracting two two-digit numbers. They had to use their speaking and listening skills to track the speakers and expand their knowledge and deepen their understanding. They also presented their chosen task or research, from the homework menu to the rest of the class. It was a day full of creativity, collaboration and skill-building.



In **Skylarks Class**, one of the activities the children did was to listen to a selection of different theme tunes, all written by the same composer – John Williams, and to talk about how each piece made them feel and what it was about the music that made them feel that way. They talked about the volume, the tempo, the melody and the key, analysing how each aspect influenced their reactions. It was very interesting to hear what the tunes made the children think of and how they made them feel – everything from sad to triumphant!



This week, during **No Pens Day**, the children in **Red Kites Class** enjoyed learning how to debate! They held three debates on topics such as "All children should be given calculators in their Maths lessons." The children split into teams, arguing "For" and "Against" the statements. Each team debated really well, constructing excellent arguments and demonstrating respect and active listening for the opposing side. Afterwards, the audience got to cast their votes for their chosen side! It was a great opportunity for the children to practice their communication skills and critical thinking.

Another highlight of the day was Arthur's amazing show and tell where he shared a very personal story with the class. A huge well done to Arthur for being so brave, and to the Red Kites class for the support, empathy and appreciation they showed their friend.



For No Pens Day, the children in **Kestrels Class** carried out a wide range of speaking and listening activities. After reciting some tricky tongue twisters, the children planned and performed a Charlie Chaplin style play set to authentic 1920s silent film music. Later in the day the children became the teachers, sharing their talents with each other including ballet, horse riding, Kung Fu and boxing. All the children thoroughly enjoyed the opportunity to teach as well as learn something new from their friends. It was a wonderful day full of creativity, collaboration and fun!





On Wednesday this week, our **Boys and Girls Football Team** played matches against Holyport Primary School. Whist the Girls Team faced a tough game and lost 3-1, their effort and determination were commendable. The Boys Team secured an impressive 1-0 victory, showcasing fantastic teamwork and skill. We are incredibly proud of both teams, demonstrating our school values of determination, team work and perseverance. A huge well done

and congratulations to everyone for a brilliant start to the season! A special thank you to Mr Errington for organising the fixtures and to our parents for providing transport and cheering the teams with your amazing support!

What have we been learning in school?

This week in Science, the children in Nightingales Class took part in an exciting experiment to explore colour diffusion. They carefully arranged Skittles in a circle on a plate and poured warm water over them. As the water dissolved the colourful coating, they were thrilled to observe the vibrant beautiful patterns forming and spreading, creating a rainbow effect. The activity not only sparked their curiosity but also encouraged them to think about how materials dissolve and mix. It was a fantastic hands-on experience that brought science to life in a colourful and engaging way!













Building Work Update:

This week, we have seen further progress on the construction project. The builders have been hard at work installing high quality insulation materials on the walls (with insulation work on the ceiling to begin next week) to ensure our additional learning space remain warm and energy - efficient during the cold winter months. This will provide a comfortable environment

where children can focus on their learning. Work has also begun on the roof and the window structures have been fitted, marking another exciting milestone in the project. Stay tuned for more updates in the coming weeks.











Next week we will be looking at **Truthfulness**. Children will be listening to stories, discussing and reflecting on 'When have you made something up that was fun? E.g. playing, stories, inventing. When have you told the truth? E.g. explaining events, telling facts. Which did you prefer and why?' for KS1 or 'Should you always try to seek truth?' for KS2. Perhaps you can have a discussion at home and spend some time with your child exploring the meaning of the quote: 'We learned about honesty and integrity - that the truth matters... that you don't take shortcuts or play by your own set of rules... and success doesn't count unless you earn it fair and square.' - Michelle Obama, First Lady United States 2009-2017 (1964 -) What might this quote mean? Let us try to encourage children to be alert to what is pretend and what is the truth and help them understand that seeking truth can be a long journey and requires patience.
