What a fabulous week of learning we have had! This week, as part of Maidenhead's Big Read, children enjoyed more book celebration events: Children in Owls and KS1 enjoyed an exciting virtual session with Donna David. On Tuesday we all took part in an inspiring whole school assembly led by the renowned poet, Simon Mole. During the follow up workshops led by Simon, the children in their class explored a range of ideas and techniques to craft their own poems, guided by Simon's expert demonstrations and creative modelling. The sessions were not only informative but also incredibly enjoyable, sparking curiosity and enthusiasm for poetry across the school. Our young writers have produced some fantastic poems, showcasing creativity, imagination and flair – we may have discovered some talented poets of the future! Here are some comments from the children and a selection of photos capturing their wonderful experiences...



We listened to a dinosaur poem written by Simon Mole. The children enjoyed spotting and naming the dinosaurs. They looked at the dinosaur skeleton and guessed what the crest might have been used for, exploring different sounds. Then we listened to

the poem about the Parasaurolophus echoes. Teasaurus Footysaurus lives in a supermarket. - Jemima and Oliver I really liked it because I thought it was really fun when Simon made us news reporters and we had to commentate on the picture displayed on the board. - Charlie
