Dear Parents/Carers,

What an eventful week we have had!

It was wonderful to see and talk to so many of you at **Parent Evenings** this week. Thank you very much for coming to see your child's Class Teacher and spending time discussing your child's progress. We hope you enjoyed viewing your children's work and found the information you received useful and know how you can support your child/ren. We believe that working in partnership with parents is an integral part of your child's success; your support is very much appreciated and will most certainly optimise your child's progress. If for any reason, you were not able to attend on either of the specified evenings, please do talk to your child's Class Teacher so that another appointment can be made. Please do not feel that these meetings are the only opportunity to speak with Class Teachers, you are always welcome to speak to your child's Class Teacher at the end of the day if you so wish. On Tuesday this week, Robins Class hosted an engaging **Open Maths Session** for parents. The focus of the session was on recognising simple fractions and working out fractions of given numbers. Parents had the opportunity to observe and participate in various activities designed to help children understand fractions in a fun and interactive way. The children demonstrated their ability to identify fractions such as halves, quarters, and thirds, and applied their knowledge to solve practical problems involving fractions of numbers. The session was a wonderful success. We hope you have gained insights into how Maths is taught at WSL, enhancing your understanding of the methods and strategies used in the classroom. At the **Writing Workshop for parent in Owls,** held on Wednesday this week, Miss Painter shared the Early Learning Goals for writing and explained how Early Years Team support children in making the transition to Year One. She highlighted the importance of using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops in their writing. To give parents practical ideas for supporting writing at home, Miss Painter modelled *Red Ditties* and *Green Get Writing books* from the RWI Phonics programme, showing how children can *hold a sentence* and *complete a sentence* at home. She also discussed using picture stimuli to write for different purposes, such as making lists, writing weekend news and cards. Miss Painter also discussed proof reading and editing their work, using a different colour to mark their changes. She emphasised the importance of correct letter formation, especially as children prepare for Year One and begin formal handwriting. Miss Painter answered parents' questions and offered advice on making writing as fun and interesting as possible by linking it to children's interests. We hope you have found the session helpful and took away some useful tips to support your child's learning at home.

We were honoured to welcome Alex Barfield, the High Sheriff of the Royal County of Berkshire 2024-2025, to our school for a special assembly on Wednesday this week. This event was a significant highlight, providing children with valuable insights into law enforcement and community safety. During the assembly, the High Sheriff shared his roles and responsibilities, explaining his voluntary position and the importance of his work in the community. The children were particularly fascinated by his attire and the ceremonial sword, sparking a lively Q&A session. They asked many questions about his uniform and the history behind it. The engaging discussions and interactive sessions left a lasting impression, fostering a sense of responsibility and awareness among the children. It was a memorable experience that we hope will inspire our children to contribute positively to their community. We extend our sincere thanks to the High sheriff for taking the time to visit us. His presence and support means a great deal to our village school.


I found it very interesting to learn about what sheriffs did in the past. - Ava

From April 2025, the cost of meals will increase by 10p per meal (meal price of £2.79 from April).
