Working brilliantly as a team, they showcased their mathematical thinking, problem-solving skills, and collaboration—and their hard work paid off! Our team **won first place**, earning the top prize of a £50 book voucher for the school, along with £15 book vouchers and Gold Certificates for each team member.

The children thoroughly enjoyed the experience, rising to the challenge and confidently applying their mathematical skills in a competitive context. Their enthusiasm and teamwork were clear to see throughout the event.



In a special moment, the team was presented with the prestigious **John Stephenson Shield** by the Mayor of RBWM, Councillor Simon Bond, alongside Rotary President Mark Loader. The shield will be proudly displayed in school for a whole year.

We are incredibly proud of our young mathematicians—not only for their achievement but for the way they represented our school with confidence, teamwork, and enthusiasm. Well done, children!









# What have we been learning in school?

As part of their Art topic this term, the children in Robins Class have been exploring **Sculpture and 3D design**, with a particular focus on working with clay. They have enjoyed creating their own imaginative figures, using a variety of techniques to shape and decorate their work. They have learned how to flatten and smooth clay, roll it into different forms, and add texture through mark-making. The children have shown increasing control and creativity when using both their hands and specialist tools to manipulate malleable materials. This hands-on experience has helped them build confidence and develop their artistic skills in a fun and engaging way.
