Dear Parents/Carers,

This week, our **Year 2 children in Robins Class** have made a fantastic start to their **optional SATs**, working hard to complete their Reading tests. We are incredibly proud of the focus and effort they have shown. After the May half-term holiday, the children will continue with their assessments, including Maths, Spelling, Grammar, and Punctuation. These tests are an important part of helping us understand each child's progress and support their learning as they move forward.

We kindly ask Year 2 parents to avoid booking any holidays or appointments during this ongoing assessment period. Where possible, please arrange any necessary doctor or dentist visits outside of school hours, as it is essential that children are in school every day to ensure they do not miss any key lessons, assessments, or opportunities to demonstrate what they know.

During the May holiday, you might like to support your child by **revisiting key skills in Reading, Grammar, and basic Maths**, such as number bonds, times tables, and spelling patterns. Please refer to the Home learning Support Information for details. A little practice and encouragement can make a big difference to their confidence and readiness. Thank you for your support.

What have we been learning in school?
