# Dear Parents/Carers,

KS2 SATs will take place next week. Our Year 6 children and staff have been working incredibly hard throughout the year to prepare for this important moment. A few key reminders - these really do make a difference:

- Make sure your child has early nights and gets plenty of sleep.
- Ensure your child has healthy, tasty breakfast and stays well hydrated.
- Ensure your child arrives at school on time every day, feeling calm and ready the day will start with the usual registration routines.
- If your child is unwell, please contact the school from 8.00am onwards. We will make arrangements for your child to take the test away from others and also agree a collection time.

For all parents, please avoid booking holidays or appointments during this on-going assessment period. If unavoidable, try to make doctor or dentist appointments outside of school hours as much as possible. Daily attendance is essential so children do not miss important learning, assessments or tests.
