A highlight of the celebration was the ceremonial cutting of the red ribbon by The Mayor and our School Council. The Mayor then formally declared the Learning Space open! - a proud and memorable moment that marked the beginning of a new chapter for our school community.

This week, three professional **tree surgeons from Calibra** visited our school to carry out essential work of **removing dead wood** from several large trees on the school ground to ensure the continued health of the trees and the safety of everyone on site. The children were absolutely fascinated as they watched the team skilfully climb high into the branches and use specialist equipment to cut away the dead wood. We were amazed by the amount that was removed and how carefully the surgeons worked to protect the living parts of the trees. It was a wonderful learning opportunity and sparked lots of interest and questions about tree care, safety, and the natural environment.
